Annual Celtic Celebration to Offer Celtic Entertainment, Plus New Additions

WHEELING, W.Va. – March 2, 2020 – The 24th annual Wheeling Celtic Celebration will take place March 7 at the Wheeling Artisan Center. The event will feature Celtic entertainment, food and drinks, and new this year, programming about Celtic traditions and history. The event, co-hosted by Wheeling Heritage and River City Restaurant, runs from 10 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Artisan Center, 1400 Main Street.

The day will begin with a free panel discussion on Celtic traditions, including a breakfast buffet, from 10 to 11 a.m. From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Wheeling Genealogical Society will be providing free mini genealogy sessions. A free Irish whiskey tasting and discussion will take place from 2 to 3 p.m.

Live entertainment begins at 1:30 p.m. on the third floor and includes the Burke Conroy School of Irish Dance, Gallowglass, Terry Griffith, and Brigid's Cross. Several Celtic-themed vendors will be set up on the third floor. Entrance to the live entertainment portion of the evening is \$5. Admission for those 12 and under is free.

River City Restaurant will be open to offer their regular menu selections on the first floor, and will offer ethnic food selections on the third floor, including Scotch Eggs, Colcannon, and other Celtic delicacies as well as imported and domestic beers.
