Small Business Program Seeks Entrepreneurs

WHEELING, W.Va. – Dec. 29, 2020 – Wheeling Heritage and Regional Economic Development Partnership (RED) are now accepting applications for the fifth session of CO.STARTERS, a program for entrepreneurs and small business owners. The program equips entrepreneurs of all kinds with the insights, relationships and tools needed to turn business ideas into action.

Those who are interested in starting a business or want to expand a current business can apply at wheelingheritage.org/costarters. The program will meet every Thursday evening for ten weeks, beginning Jan. 21, 2021, from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., via Zoom. Applications are due Jan. 6. The cost to participate, including materials, is \$100.

Drawing from the experience of successful entrepreneurs and start-up veterans from around the globe, CO.STARTERS walks creative small-business owners through lean, effective business modeling methods in a simple and intuitive way, and with the help of a supportive community. Rather than treating a start-up like a large corporation and writing a detailed business plan, CO.STARTERS participants are encouraged to build and test small models first. In the process, participants receive real-time customer feedback, update their models to meet customer needs and avoid creating businesses based on incorrect assumptions.

So far, more than 40 entrepreneurs have completed the CO.STARTERS program. Every entrepreneur was in a different stage of the business creation process, and most had no business training or experience.

After a difficult year for many small businesses, this program can help give local entrepreneurs the tools they need to regroup, rebuild and problem-solve alongside a network of people who want them to succeed.

Wheeling Heritage and RED will continue to accept applications until Jan. 6 or until 12 people sign up.
